

Maintenance

Let's keep those floors looking nice!




Moving Furniture

Always use furniture pads or similar alternatives when moving heavy objects across the floor.

• Use wide, non-staining floor protectors for your furniture—aim for at least 1 inch in diameter, made of hard plastic or felt. For movable pieces, look for casters with at least a 3/4-inch flat surface. If you have metal protectors, make sure they're rust-proof. And ditch those narrow dome rests for wider ones!

Please avoid using rubber-backed pads, as they can cause discoloration over time. These are found on the back of some rugs, but it's best to steer clear!



Remove Dirt

Sweep, dust mop, or vacuum the floor to remove all loose dirt and grit. If dirt is not completely removed before wet mopping, it will create a haze on the surface of the flooring.

- Do not use treated dust mops. Do not steam mop.
- Clean the floor using a properly diluted **Neutral pH** cleaner in cool water, or ready-to-use spray cleaner that will not leave a residue such as *Bona Professional Series* Stone, Tile, and Laminate Cleaner in a pre-mixed spray bottle. Follow label instructions.




Maintenance



Ring Out Mop

If wet mopped, make sure the mop is well wrung out.



Never, ever...use a steam mop, it can ruin your floors. Friends don't let friends ruin their brand new floors.



Close blinds or curtains where bright sunlight hits the floor for extended periods of time. Prolonged exposure to heat and sunlight can cause most home furnishings to fade.



Prevention

The single greatest cause of damage to any flooring or floor finish is abrasion from dirt and grit.



Do's

Wherever possible, use walk off mats at entrances and doorways. Mats and rugs should not utilize latex or rubber backings. Sweep or vacuum the floor regularly to remove loose dirt.

Use non-staining floor protectors under heavy furniture, chairs, and tables.

Always protect floors when moving heavy objects to prevent permanent scratches and tears.

Clean up spills immediately. Damp mop the floors as needed, using clean water and a diluted floor cleaner.



Don'ts

DO NOT steam mop.

DO NOT tape floor protection to your LVP. Tape can damage surfaces. Oil or petroleum-based products can result in surface staining. **DO NOT** track asphalt-driveway sealer or automobile-oil drips onto the vinyl floor covering.

DO NOT use vacuums that have a beater bar. If it has one, turn it off.

- DO NOT use electric brooms with hard plastic bottoms with no padding.
- DO NOT use harsh cleaners or chemicals on the floor.
- DO NOT use abrasive scrubbing tools.

DO NOT use detergents, abrasive cleaners or "mop and shine" products.



NOTE:

Vinyl flooring, like other types of smooth floors, may become slippery when wet. Allow time for floor to dry after cleaning. Immediately wipe up wet areas from spills, foreign substances or wet feet.
